APPLICATION DUE DATE

March 15 (for Fall admission)
October 15 (for Spring admission)

STEP 1

Send your list of nominated students by email to: karen.mcmichael@temple.edu.

Please include the following Information for each student:

- · Student's first name and surname as listed on their passport
- Student's gender
- · Student's e-mail address
- Date of Birth (Month/Date/Year)
- Current Year in School
- Semester(s) (fall and/or spring) and year student will study at Temple
- TOEFL/IELTS/Duolingo Score (if your degree program is not taught in English)

NOTE: For students pursuing an LL.M. degree, a certified score report sent directly from the testing company to our office is required. For one-semester study abroad students, the partner school can simply notify our office of each student's score.

STEP 2

Students formally nominated by their home institution (Step 1) will receive instructions by email to complete this application.

STEP 3

Admitted students and home institution will be notified by email of their acceptance.

STEP 4

Admitted students will be given a Temple email address and student ID number. All Temple messages and communications will be sent to the students' Temple email account. Please encourage students to check their Temple email accounts regularly.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY (I-20 APPLICATION)

Once admitted, Temple will issue an I-20 to apply for a student visa. Obtaining a student visa can take several weeks.

Please complete this application NO LATER than eight weeks before your arrival in the United States, but we STRONGLY encourage you to apply sooner.

REQUIRED FINANCIAL DOCUMENTATION

A student visa requires you to prove you have adequate funds to complete your study abroad program. Please consult this listof acceptable forms of financial documentation

for the Certificate of Eligibility/I-20 application. Your financial documents should show you have enough funding to cover the cost of tuition for the upcoming academic semester (or the upcoming academic year if you plan to study at Temple for 2 semesters). You should also have enough funding for living expenses such as housing, transportation, food, books, and health insurance.

The source for your funds can come from you, your parents, family members, scholarships, or an organization choosing to support you. Please prepare your financial documentation according to the category below that applies to you.
