Between 1986 and 1990, he studied at the Apáczay Csere János Preparatory High school of the ELTE (Eötvös Lóránd University) - being enrolled in a special class where the emphasis was laid on complex natural sciences as main field of study - in Budapest, where he graduated in 1990 and was admitted to the Faculty of Law and Political Sciences of the JPTE (Janus Pannonius University, Pécs) in the same year. He acted as a substitute teaching assistant already as a sophomore. At the JPTE, he worked as a demonstrator in the Legal Informatics Group from the second year of his studies and from 1993 in the Department of Criminal Procedure. In 1995, his thesis as BA paper (entitled „ Points of View and Criteria Regarding the Introduction of Bail „) was awarded the Special Prize of the National Police Chief as the first prize winner in the Criminal Procedure Section of the National Student Conference.

He graduated summa cum laude from the University in 1995 and passed the bar exam in 1997 being rated as excellent.

Since 1th of April 1995, he has been working at the Department of Criminal Procedure and Criminalistics (1996-1999 - Criminal Sciences, 1995-1996 and 1999-2005 - Criminal Procedure) of the University of Pécs, until 30 September 1995 as a research assistant, since 1th of October 1995 as a university assistant, since 1th of April 2000 as a university assistant professor, since 1th of May 2003 as a university associate professor, since 1th September 2014 as a university professor. Since 2006, Head of the Department of Criminal Procedure and Criminalistics at the Faculty of Law of the University of Pécs (from 2013, the department was renamed the Department of Criminal and Civil Procedure). He was the vice dean of the Faculty between 2013 and 2018.

From January 1996 to 2007 he was the organizer of the Additional Correspondence Course of the Police Officers' Supplementary Correspondence Course of the University of Pécs. Subsequently, he was the head of the Criminal Law Specialist Training Course and the Specialist Training Course in Criminal Law and Law Enforcement Specialist. In addition, he was a trainee lawyer from October 1995, and after passing the bar exam in 1997, he became a second job attorney. Since August 2003, he has been a censor of professional examinations.

Since 2010, he has also taught criminal procedure at the Faculty of Law and Political Science of the Károli Gáspár Reformed University. Since February 2011, he has been a member of the University Council of the Károli Gáspár Reformed University, and since 2016, he has been a member of the Doctoral and Habilitation Council of the Faculty of Law and Political Science of the University of Pécs. In May 2016, he was appointed as the Faculty Coordinator of the Internationalisation Strategy of the Faculty of Law and Political Sciences of the University of Pécs. In 2020, he was appointed by the MAB as the Chair of the Visiting Committee for the accreditation procedure of the Doctoral School of Law and Political Sciences of Pázmány Péter Catholic University. He has published more than two hundred papers, including three major monographs, ten academic notes in Hungarian and one in English, chapters in six academic textbooks and ten academic notes (three of them in foreign languages).

He started his PhD studies in the autumn of 1995 and graduated in 1998. In 1998, he obtained a PhD degree *summa cum laude*. In 2000, the working discussion of his PhD thesis „Theoretical and practical issues of pre-trial detention” was held. The dissertation was defended in 2001 and was accepted *summa cum laude* by the Evaluation Committee of the Doctoral Council of the University of Pécs Faculty of Law.

In 2008, he also habilitated *summa cum laude* with a classroom lecture on „Consensual elements in criminal procedure in the light of constitutional principles” and a scientific lecture on „Absprache im Strafprozess” („Agreement in criminal procedure”).

In 2013, he defended his doctoral thesis at the Hungarian Academy of Sciences with his monograph entitled „The prohibition of aggravation in criminal proceedings”.

After obtaining of the academic degree, he is an active participant in the PhD training.
